## CLASSICS

### 1. Helsinki Cathedral and Senate Square

One of the most recognisable symbols of Helsinki and its silhouette since 1852.

### 2. Torikorttelit

The historical centre. The narrow streets are lined with restaurants, cafés and design shops.

### 3. Uspenski Cathedral

One of the largest Orthodox churches in Western Europe. Beautiful icons and paintings.

### 4. Esplanade Park

The main avenue, a place to relax and watch the people stroll by.

### 5. Market Square and Sightseeing Cruises

Traditional open-air market sells local food and souvenirs. Sightseeing cruises depart from the waterfront.

### 6. Sibelius Monument and Park

The monument is one of the most popular attractions in Helsinki, designed by Eila Hiltunen.

## CULTURE & ARCHITECTURE

### 7. Kamppi Chapel of Silence

This fine example of contemporary wooden architecture is a place to meditate in the heart of the city.

### 8. Oodi

Oodi is Helsinki's new Central Library and a living meeting place in the city centre on the Kansalaistori Square. Oodi is a venue for events, a house of reading and a diverse urban experience.

### 10. Finlandia Hall

A world-famous venue for conferences, concerts and events, designed by legendary Alvar Aalto.

### 11. National Museum of Finland

A beautiful Art Nouveau building. Presents Finnish history from prehistoric times to the 19th century.

This architecturally unique church was built into solid rock.

## NATURE & OUTDOORS

### 36. Suomenlinna Sea Fortress

One of the most popular attractions in Finland and a UNESCO World Heritage site. Guided tours, museums & restaurants.

### 37. Vallisaari, Lonna and Isosaari Islands

(waterbus May–Sep) On **Vallisaari** you can enjoy the archipelago flora and spectacular views. Guided tours and summer activities as well as a restaurant and cafés.

Historical and idyllic **Lonna** island has a restaurant and a public sauna. **Isosaari** is one of Helsinki's outer islands, unique nature and sights. Beautiful scenery, rich cultural history, untouched nature.

### 38. Töölönlahti Bay

The large bay in the centre of the city. One of the most popular jogging spots. Historical wooden villas on the opposite shore. Many summer cafés.

### 39. Seurasaari Island and Open-Air Museum

Traditional wooden buildings relocated from across Finland. A popular outdoor recreational area with cafés and restaurants, beaches and events. Bus 24.



## SAUNAS

### 21. Allas Sea Pool

The amazing new spa complex has a large pool area and saunas. In addition to swimming, bathing and good food, Allas offers many wellness and entertainment options. Close by you see all the best sights of Helsinki in 10 minutes with the Flytour XD and take a ride on SkyWheel Helsinki.

### 22. Lonna Island Sauna

Lonnas sauna pays homage to the traditional sauna culture. The log-built cabin has saunas with lofts for both men and women. Both saunas can accommodate up to 24 guests at a time. Open only in summer.

### 23. Löyly

At the impressive Löyly design sauna you can experience a traditional wood-heated or smoke sauna, take a dip in the Baltic Sea and enjoy great food with a breathtaking view.

### 24. Kotiharjun Sauna

Opened back in 1928, Kotiharju is a traditional wood-heated neighbourhood sauna that provides an authentic feel for the Finnish sauna culture.

## FAMILY FUN

### 25. Helsinki City Museum

This museum of everyday life offers new perspectives on the history of the city. An entertaining Children's Town exhibition for young visitors.

### 26. Natural History Museum

This museum showcases the diversity of nature. A fascinating journey through Finland.

### 27. Helsinki Zoo

This zoo on the island of Korkeasaari is one of the oldest in the world (est. 1889). Bus 16.

### 28. Linnanmäki Amusement Park

(Open May–Oct) & SEA LIFE Helsinki (Open all year)

Linnanmäki's 66-year-old wooden rollercoaster is still the most popular ride! SEA LIFE is a home to piranhas, crabs and starfish as well as sharks and rays.

### Playgrounds in the center of Helsinki

Helsinki has over 60 wonderful playgrounds where kids can swing, climb, jump and run around to their hearts' delight. Here are a few spots:



## Getting Around

### PUBLIC TRANSPORT



Single ticket from a machine for zones A and B (Helsinki center and outskirts) 2,80€, day ticket 8€. You can use: trams, buses, metro, Suomenlinna ferry and commuter trains in Helsinki.

**Sightseeing:** A great way to experience the city is to hop on tram 2 or 3.

**Public ferry to Suomenlinna:** The public ferry (HSL) to Suomenlinna operates all year round. **Waterbuses:** In summertime you can also take a water bus (JT-Line) that stops at the islands of Vallisaari and Lonna. Suomen Saaristokuljetus operates to Vallisaari and Isosaari as well as to Korkeasaari.

### AIRPORT TRANSPORTATION

**Trains:** Around 30 minutes from Central Railway Station. Train lines I and P. Buy a ticket for zones A, B and C in advance for 4,10€, day ticket 11€.

**Finnair City Bus:** From the Central Railway Station every 20 min. You can purchase tickets from the driver.

**Taxis:** Estimated cost from the city centre 40–50 €.
